01: Project management handbook

The Intellectual Outputs of the DISCO project have been implemented in line with the project proposal as well as in line with initial expectations and plans.

This intellectual output was not considered eligible for funding. The project coordinator implemented it with its own resources. This output was considered relevant by the partnership.

To be exact, a detailed project management handbook was prepared by the leading partner South East European University and available for all project –partners.

This project management handbook is intended for anyone who is involved in DISCO Erasmus+ Project. It was written in English language for illustrating the management and reporting procedures to be followed by all partners.

02: Education staff needs for ICT integration in Schools Research Analysis

During the first 6 months of the project, a comparative survey was carried out in each participating organizations' countries with a focus on the strategy of ICT integration in schools. The entire Project was leaved from the existing best/ bad practices of each Consortium Partner.

The partners also analysed both best and bad case-studies in order to investigate the reasons of success/ failure and learn lessons for potential good applications of the mechanisms which stand at the basis of them. Analysis of study cases were done in each country. Best practices and recommendations for harmonization with European regulations were also done.

Moreover, only the partners from Macedonia collected best practices in the manner of competition. The same could not be done by the other Project partners' countries. Mainly, every person who work in educational organization applied for the best practice competition. To compete the participant were asked to make short video of implementing ICT in educational institution (in form of tutorial, class or any form that can be of help of others to implement), upload it on Youtube and share the link to Partner organization with a short description in English. The partners from Macedonia made Facebook (FB) groups to share the videos for all project partners separately. Macedonian partners chose the winner in form of "who will have most likes on FB partners' page".

The winner was Sonja Atanasovska (ASUC BoroPetrusevski - Skopje) and she will participate on training in El-Rompido (Huelva).
